When we opened School of Rock we said we never wanted to turn a child away because they couldn't afford a music education, said Stacey Marmolejo, School of Rock Twin Cities franchise owner. Back then we self-funded all of our scholarships but the need has grown too great. We are very grateful to now have a partner who can help us raise funds AND provide the tax benefit our donors deserve for their generosity.

While School of Rock teaches music and performance, we also teach students to be responsible musicians. One of those responsibilities includes using their talent to give back to the community, added Marmolejo. And what better recipient than young musicians in Minnesota -- students in the same community, same age group and with the same interests as the current School of Rock students.

We are extremely grateful to School of Rock Twin Cities for the recognition of the work that we do, says Wendy Winks, RSSF's Co-Founder and Executive Director. It's wonderful that Twin Cities area students will receive additional tuition assistance to attend the program because of this important fundraiser.

School of Rock Twin Cities Regional Manager, Nate Beck, is in discussions with more than a dozen of the Twin Cities most iconic musicians and expects to begin announcing the lineup in the next two-three days.
